Have you been exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID-19?

Exposure is defined as:

- Closer than 6 feet for longer than 15 minutes
- Up to 2 days before symptoms started or before the positive test was collected
- Both individuals were NOT masked

Are you fully vaccinated?

(2 weeks after 2nd dose in 2 dose series or 2 weeks after a single dose vaccine)

No further action is recommended..

You do NOT need to stay home if you are NOT showing symptoms.

- Self monitor for symptoms for 14 days from the date you were exposed.
- It is recommended you get tested 3-5 days after you were exposed.
- At this time, all individuals are recommended to mask in indoor settings.

If you begin to experience symptoms, stay home, be evaluated by a healthcare provider, and be tested if it is recommended.

Stay home through day 10 if no symptoms have developed
